

2015/2016 was another great year for the Parents Association in terms of fundraising. Last December our treasurer Anthony Dunne set a target to raise €7,000. Well, due to the commitment and hard work of our fundraisers, we exceeded the target and made a total of €8,144 (50% increase from last year). The Parents Association donated €7,685 to the school (57% increase from last year). With this money the Parents Association funded the purchase of a new defibrillator.
