
31st August – First day for Junior Infants

Arshmaan Sohail reporting from 5th Class


Ms Whelan's class have been doing many things. First, I asked them what they had been learning and they said that in maths they are doing algebra and percentages and also decimals.

They are also did history and learned about the famine and the French and American Revolutions.


